low-cost transportation is an absolute must. Thanks to one of my neighbors, I learned about RTS Access and began booking rides right away. The drivers are always friendly, caring, and sensitive to my needs as a partially disabled person. Given my numerous exceptional experiences with RTS Access, I'm excited to introduce you all to them as well! Enjoy!

RTS Access is RTS' paratransit program that provides coordinated ride-sharing transportation for people with disabilities who are unable to ride RTS transit buses due to their disability. As an origin-to-destination service, RTS Access routinely provides curb-to-curb service with exterior door-to-exterior door service provided upon advanced notice.

How to Sign Up: Sign up online or download the app through the App Store or Google Play. Before you enroll, make sure to have your RTS Access I.D., date of birth and your e-mail address

handy. After you sign up, you'll receive a confirmation e-mail to complete the process. Please check your spam filter if you don't receive the e-mail.

What to Remember When Using RTS Access Ride Request:

- You can book up to seven days in advance until 5:00 p.m. the day before your trip day.
- A trip is only one way for us, so if you book a round trip (for example, home to work and then work to home), remember to book both trips online.
- Once a trip is booked it can't be changed. To make changes, you need to cancel the trip and book another trip.
- Don't forget the 20-minute window: RTS Access buses can arrive 5 minutes before your scheduled trip and up to 15 minutes after. When you book your trip, the timeframe is provided. It's always a good idea to write it down.

How to Schedule a Ride: Call (585) 224-8330. Have the following information ready:

- Your name
- Date of your trip(s)
- Your pickup and destination address: let the scheduler know at which entrance you want to be picked up. When helpful, name buildings or landmarks.
- Your cell phone number, if applicable, or the telephone number at your destination.
- The time you wish to be picked up.
- If you'll be traveling with a PCA (Personal Care Assistant), guest(s), or both, please notify the scheduler if the PCA or guest is traveling with any mobility devices.

Please supply the same information for the return trip. The scheduler can name the pickup and drop off times that will most closely meet your travel request needs.

That just means we're not a place where people would get weekly groceries and we may also request certain budget or household information for services.

In some of our youth programs, there may be a registration fee (for instance-summer camp), but there are no ongoing charges for meals, program supplies, etc.

We're a human services agency that offers aid for residents of all ages. We collaborate with a wide array of agencies to offer comprehensive services to the neighborhoods served.

Those include emergency programs that meet your basic needs, those that help you stay stable, and after-school and summer enrichment programs for youth. You can obtain breakfast and lunch each weekday and take part in activities that help you remain active and independent.

We offer a Senior Center program, children and youth programs. 8:30 a.m. -4:00 p.m. Family services such as emergency food, children's clothing closet, and accessing benefits. There are free personal care products (such as toiletries, laundry detergent, soap, toilet paper), as well as canned food. There are children's clothes, formula, and other baby products.

Alcoholism: Alcohol addiction is characterized by drinking alcohol compulsively, being unable to control how much you drink, and feeling anxious or stressed when you're not drinking. Our treatment for alcohol addiction may involve brief intervention, an outpatient program, or inpatient alcohol rehab in New York. The main goal of our treatment is to stop alcohol use to improve the quality of your life.

Opioid Addiction: Opioid rehabs specialize in supporting those recovering from opioid addiction. They treat those suffering from addiction to illegal opioids like heroin, as well as prescription drugs like oxycodone. These centers typically combine both physical as well as mental and emotional support to help stop addiction. Physical support often includes medical detox and subsequent medical support (including medication), and mental support includes in-depth therapy to address the underlying causes of addiction.

Substance Abuse: In New York you'll find substance abuse treatment programs that can help you address your addiction, and any co-occurring mental health disorders. These programs utilize evidence-based therapies such as cognitive-behavioral therapy (CBT), dialectical behavior therapy (DBT), and psychodynamic approaches to help you achieve recovery and new tools to sustain it. With various treatment options available, including outpatient, inpatient, and residential programs, you'll be able to find the resources and right level of care you need to effectively treat your addiction.

Drug Addiction: You'll participate in a variety of treatments that are designed to help you live a drug-free lifestyle.

Common methods of our treatment include group, individual, and family counseling, medication management, nutrition, exercise, and management of co-occurring mental health disorders.

Children: The Center takes a special interest in at-risk youth and children in low-income families, and/or families affected by abuse and addiction. A concerted effort is made to ensure that these young people learn that they don't have to repeat the same behaviors they've seen at home. The Center wants these children to understand that they're not the reason for the difficulties their parents face. Some of the young people at the Center take part in the mentor program which encourages them to stay in school and better themselves.

Children take part in games, role playing, singing and dancing as a way to build their social skills and help them discover their gifts and abilities. For many of these children, the activities at the Center supply a means of self-discovery.
